Deferment Period - Nil	

Restrictions

* Cover for persons over the age of 85 restricted to Benefits 1 and 2 only.

* Benefit 8 is reduced to £100 per week in respect of persons over the age of 65 years and not in gainful employment in respect of medical and ancillary expenses incurred following bodily injury.
